Public Works Update

- The department's contractors Pride Master, Inc./Westfall Contracting will be working on sidewalk-curb replacement and Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) improvements in the 1500 block of 79th Street and 8300-8400-8500 blocks of Richard Ave., weather-permitting. If our residents have any specific questions about the work, please contact the department office.
- Sanitation trash-recycling-yard waste pick-up service will run a holiday week schedule. No service will be provided on the Presidents' Day on Monday, February 17 and all weekdays' service will be shifted by one day, such as regular Monday to Tuesday, regular Tuesday to Wednesday, and on. Regularly Friday service will be provided on Saturday. The service will go back to its regular schedule after the week.
- A water main replacement project is due to begin on Tuesday, February 18, 2020 on the 500 block of East Drive from Lafon Place to Teasdale Ave. The water main had

a high rate of breaks and was warranted for this replacement project. The Water Company has notified the residents in the affected area of this project that will take 30 days to construct. The restoration of the public right-of-way will follow the 30-day water main replacement project after its bidding and scheduling for construction. We apologize for the disruption due to the works and, if our residents have questions/concerns, please contact the department office.

Parks Department Update

- Parks, Recreation and Forestry Department held their second Open House to seek resident input on a proposed Concept Plan for the redevelopment of Greensfelder Park. Citizen input has been minimal thus far, however, residents can view the plan on the City's website and make comments to the department by the end of the month. The proposed Concept Plan will be forwarded on to the Parks Commission at their March meeting for consideration.
- Centennial Commons will be operating on holiday hours (5:30 am to 6:00 pm) on Monday, February 17, 2020 for Presidents Day.

Boards and Comissions News

At this week's special meeting of CALOP the Commission unanimously voted yes on two grant funding projects: The first matching grant is up to \$10,000 to a film festival that has been held in St. Louis recently that would be interested in holding the event here in University City. Here is the link to the website for the organizers of the event: <https://www.inmotionconference.com> It would take place in October. Last year the festival had approximately 400 guests. Organizers anticipate a similar level of participation this year.

The second project they authorized is a matching grant of up to \$5,000 to Habitat for Humanity for a video about their projects in the third ward. So far there is not a completion date set for the project, but the matching grant is contingent upon CALOP approval of the production firm and other details of the project.
