Administration

After more than a year of being closed, City Hall will reopen to the public on June 1, 2021. We ask people visiting City Hall to comply with the CDC mask and social distancing guidelines. At this time, the CDC and St. Louis County advises that individuals not fully vaccinated continue to wear face coverings when in public around other people and practice social distancing.

City Hall will be open from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., Monday through Friday. Please be aware that as you enter City Hall, you will be screened. Access to City Hall will be limited to the front entrance.

Visitors with disabilities or mobility issues are encouraged to park and enter the building through our lower level parking lot and entrance, which is accessible via Trinity Drive. Upon arrival, please call the appropriate number for the desired service (numbers are noted on signage posted on the door) and arrangements will be made for you to enter. If you are unsure which service you need, please call (314) 862-6767.

Fire Department (UCFD)

The last day for the vaccine clinic is Tuesday, June 1. Details are still being worked out to host occasional pop-up clinics.

Public Works

Solid waste collection (trash, recycling and yard waste) service will not be provided on the Memorial Day Holiday, Monday, May 31, 2021. Monday collection route will be completed Tuesday and all the rest of the work week days will shift one day back. The standard Friday route will be completed on Saturday, June 5, 2021. 


