Public Works

A Commission on Storm Water Issues regular monthly meeting was held on Tuesday, July 6. The Army Corps study team updated the Commission with respect to the baseline hydraulics & hydrologic model and gained concurrence. The Commission further discussed a floodproofing survey draft, municipal operations & maintenance manual draft for compliance with Missouri Department of Natural Resources' Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System (MS4) requirements, and updates on relief map making and 3rd rain gauge install.

A Green Practices Commission regular monthly meeting was held on Thursday, July 8. The Commission discussed a sustainability strategic plan draft.

A Traffic Commission regular monthly meeting originally scheduled for Wednesday, July 14 is cancelled due to the lack of agenda items.
