A Commission on Storm Water Issues regular monthly meeting was held on Tuesday, October 5. The meeting discussion included the review of a community questionnaire for the St. Louis Regional Hazard Mitigation Plan for future stormwater funding opportunities and MSD Operations, Maintenance and Construction Improvements reimbursement program. The Commission discussed the US Army Corps General Reevaluation Report and its current criteria for the development of solution measures. There was also a discussion about surveying the community for Stormwater Master Plan development purposes and review of draft survey documents. The Commission moved to have a community survey completed per any input from the Commissioners on the survey questions. The Commission received updates about the relief map making status, technical meeting discussions with the Army Corps and flooding early warning system. Lastly the Commission discussed a Conditional Letter of Map Revision (CLOMR) application for the Markets at Olive development and received updates about its administrative process.

A Traffic Commission regular monthly meeting is scheduled for Wednesday, October 13 at 6:30 p.m. The meeting will be conducted on Zoom.

A Green Practices Commission regular monthly meeting is scheduled for Thursday, October 14 at 5:30 p.m. The meeting will be conducted on Zoom.

Fall Curbside Leaf Collection is coming up! This season's work is scheduled to begin in the East area in the work week starting on Monday, November 1, 2021. We ask that our residents rake their leaves to the curb line between the Friday before collection begins in your area and Monday 7 AM of your collection week. The truck will make only one pass per household. Please do not mix other yard waste (gumballs, trash, small tree branches/limbs, brush, grass clippings, etc.) in with leaves and continue using the yard waste collection service for the disposal of other yard waste and contact the department office at (314) 505-8560 with any questions.
