Guns are plentiful in Missouri as well as other states, and the misuse of some of these guns are also on the rise. Please lock your weapons away when at home, and try not leave any weapons in your vehicles as this is what thieves are targeting when committing larceny from your vehicles. UCPD offers free gun locks for University City Residents. Just contact UCPD clerks and verify residence status in our community.

Background checks for firearm sales reached a record high in March as the U.S. saw multiple mass shootings. [According to FBI data](#), the bureau conducted nearly 4.7 million background checks, breaking the record high that was just [set in January](#), another month that was marked with violence and turmoil.

First-Time Gun Buyers Help Push Record Sales In US

[NPR](#)   (4/26, Diaz) reports, "First time gun owners, young and old from across the country, are helping to push record levels of gun sales for what looks like the second year in a row. 'My gun store has had a run like I've never seen before,' said Todd Cotta, the owner of Kings Gun Center in Hanford, Calif., in the state's agriculturally rich Central Valley. 'It was just an avalanche of new gun buyers for the first time.' These buyers are white, Black, Asian, and Latino and come from all political beliefs. And they're being driven by uncertainty, fear, and a need to feel safe." NPR adds, "Gun sellers across the country said the pandemic and civil unrest over the last year has pushed customers to feel they must take control of their family's protection."

Residential Street Sweeping begins in the Central area on Monday, May 10, 2021 and will be performed in that work week. The Commission on Storm Water (Commission) held a meeting on Tuesday, May 4, 2021 where they received a presentation from the Army Corps of Engineers on possible options for resolving flooding from the overflow of the River Des Peres. The presentation focused on the Tentatively Selected Plan (Plan), which include the Army Corps of Engineers recommendations. The Commission evaluated the Plan and recommended modifications. The Plan will be presented to the Mayor and Council during Monday's study session. The Commission did not complete all the items on the agenda, so they will reconvene later this month.
