Public Works

Spring Curbside Leaf Collection is in progress! This service is scheduled for the East area in the work week starting on Monday, March 14, 2022. We ask that our residents rake their leaves to the curb line between the Friday before collection begins in your area and Monday 7 AM of your collection week. The truck will make only one pass per household. Please do not mix other yard waste (gumballs, trash, small tree branches/limbs, brush, grass clippings, etc.) in with leaves and continue using the yard waste collection service for the disposal of other yard waste.

A Traffic Commission regular monthly meeting was held on Wednesday, March 9. The discussion included a proposal to extend Crixdale Ln. eastwardly. The Commission provided feedback to staff's proposal and discussed related economic development suggestions.

A Green Practices Commission regular monthly meeting was held on Thursday, March 10. The discussion included the sustainability strategic plan and updates on mosquito control and dark skies regulation.

Parks, Recreation & Forestry

The Parks Commission is scheduled to meet on Tuesday, March 15, 2022 at 6:30 pm at the Heman Park Community Center.

Fire Department

The City of University City has a new Emergency and Non-Emergency information system called Code Red by OnSolve. To get alerts pertaining to emergencies and non-emergencies within University City, residents can sign up at no cost to get alerts through text messages, emails, TTD devices and phone messages. This also comes with severe weather alerts. You can sign up online or by texting. (see attachment 1).

The University City Fire Department is posting instructional videos online. There are videos for children about home fire safety and safe trick or treating, as well as videos for adults. The latest is for severe storm preparedness. Please use the link [UCFD YouTube channel](#) to view the videos.

Police Department (UCPD)

According to the Washington Post, Police grapple with community concerns as they turn to tech for their jobs, i.e., drones, robots and license plate readers.

Police across the United States are increasingly relying on emerging technologies to make their jobs more efficient. In their daily work, they are using drones, license plate readers, body cameras and gunshot detection systems to reduce injury and bodily harm. The move comes as some law enforcement agencies are struggling with retention and hiring during the pandemic, when hundreds of cops in cities including Los Angeles and New York were sidelined because of the spread of the coronavirus.

How to Register for CodeRED Alerts Online

Select Managed Account Preference →

Creating a managed account will allow you access to modify your existing notification settings and contact information, below is a list of your options:

1. SINGLE SIGN-ON ACCOUNT

To create a single sign-on account, click the button next to "Yes" and click the corresponding logo to the credentials you would like to use, either Google, Facebook or Twitter. You will be prompted to log into your account to permit access.

2. MANAGED ACCOUNT

To create a managed account, click the button next to "Yes" and create a username and password. Please be sure to record this information for later use. (username: 6 characters or more, password: 8)

3. NON-MANAGED ACCOUNT

You will not have another option to create an account later in the form, or have the ability to log back in and update your contact information at a later date.





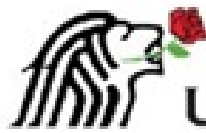
