HOUSING AND THIRD WARD REVITALIZATION TASK FORCE

The Housing and Third Ward Revitalization Task Force met virtually on Monday, September 19th. No public comments were received for the meeting. The task force discussed whether to recommend the hiring of a consultant. The following actions were taken at the meeting on Monday:

- The task force voted 7-1 (1 absent) to remove any reference to city-wide housing program from the proposed Scope of Work.
- The task force voted 8-0 (1 absent) to accept the other proposed changes to the Scope of Work and to recommend the city issue an RFP/RFP to engage a Community Development Planning partner to assist the task force in creating a revitalization plan and housing strategy for the 3rd Ward.
- The task force voted 8-0 (1 absent) to recommend that a separate RFP/RFQ be issued at a later date for the creation of a city-wide housing strategy.

The task force also agreed to move the November and December meetings to the first Monday to avoid meeting the week of Thanksgiving and Christmas. The task force voted to continue meeting on the 3rd Monday of every month for calendar year 2023. The task force has requested a presentation from Planning and Development for its November or December meeting. Additionally, a request was made to extend an invitation to Senator Brian Williams with the hope that he can provide the task force with insight on flooding in the 3rd Ward.

Mayor and Council

The Mayor and Council are scheduled to meet on Tuesday, September 27, 2022, starting with a study session at 6:00 p.m. followed by the regular meeting starting at 6:30 p.m.

FALL BULK ITEM COLLECTION

The City will begin the normal Fall Bulk Item Collection beginning the week of September 26 for the West Area. Participating residential households can place curbside three (3) large items or up to seven (7) smaller household items.

All acceptable items (furniture, bedding, cabinets, doors, windows, rugs, carpet, mattresses, box springs, washer and fryers, refrigerators, small air conditioners, sinks and toilets) must be placed at the front curb (not alley) by the Sunday night before collection begins in the area. Crews will be in each area collecting items during the entire week and will make only one pass on each street.

Items such as televisions, computer monitors, hazardous materials, commercial items, business equipment, yard waste, tree trunks, logs, building or construction type debris and materials, tires, auto batteries, motors, railroad ties, barrel drums, concrete bricks, landscape stones, boulders, rocks, dirt, roofing materials, siding, fluorescent tubes, and household trash will not be accepted.
