Exciting news for University City residents and fitness enthusiasts: the Centennial Commons gymnasium and indoor soccer field will reopen on Monday! Starting bright and early at 5:30 a.m., visitors can enjoy these upgraded facilities during the new operational hours: Monday through Friday from 5:30 a.m. to 8:00 p.m., Saturdays from 8:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m., and Sundays from 10:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m.

Access is available to those with Centennial Commons memberships or recreation ID cards, which can be purchased on-site. Proof of residency is

required for resident rates, with occupancy permits obtainable from City Hall. Youth under 10 must be accompanied by an adult.

Starting October 22, residents can vote absentee at various satellite locations across the region or drop off their completed mail absentee ballots at these sites.

When election season is over, what happens to all those plastic yard signs? These signs and their metal frames cannot be recycled through single-stream recycling programs. This year, following the November 5 election, University City is participating in a regional effort organized by the St. Louis Green Business Challenge to responsibly collect and recycle campaign signs.

On Friday, November 8 you can drop off your campaign yard signs in the Centennial Commons parking lot near the pool lobby. The signs must be separated from the metal frames. **Please note that ONLY corrugated plastic signs and their metal frames will be accepted.** NO plastic wrap/film, cardboard, or laminated cardboard signs.


