Mirela Celaj Appointed Director of Public Works

Protect & Serve: Department of Public Safety Updates

The University City Police Department is sharing important tips to help residents protect their lawn equipment from theft this spring and summer. To prevent theft, residents are encouraged to mark their



equipment, install GPS trackers, and maintain a detailed inventory with pictures and serial numbers. Storing equipment in a locked shed or garage and using security measures like alarms, cameras, and floodlights can also help deter criminals. The University City Police Department is also encouraging residents and business owners to join the Community Camera Program to enhance public safety. By registering private security cameras, participants can assist law enforcement in solving crimes by providing valuable footage when incidents occur nearby. Registration strengthens community-police partnerships and helps deter criminal activity.

U.C.P.D. Community Camera Program



The University City Police Department is inviting residents and business owners to participate in the Community Camera Program to help enhance public safety. If you have private security cameras at your home or business, registering them with the police department can assist in solving crimes and keeping the community safe.

How It Works:

Many property owners may not realize their security cameras could capture valuable evidence during criminal incidents. By registering your cameras, officers can quickly identify nearby cameras that may have recorded important footage. You will only be contacted if an incident occurs near your cameras, and the department may request to review the footage to aid investigations.

Why Register?

- Helps police identify and apprehend criminals.
- Strengthens the partnership between the community and law enforcement.
- Enhances neighborhood safety and crime prevention efforts.

Forest Park Owls: Hiding in Plain Sight

The Friends of University City Public Library invite you to their annual meeting, which will feature a fascinating lecture about local wildlife from award-winning naturalist Mark H.X. Glenshaw. Glenshaw has closely observed and documented the lives of Great Horned Owls in Forest Park since December 2005 and his lecture, "Forest Park Owls: Hiding in Plain Sight," will cover how he found these owls, basic facts about the species, and uses many of his photos and videos to illustrate the amazing behaviors of these beautiful birds.

The event begins at 6:15 p.m. with a brief meeting of the Friends, followed by Glenshaw's lecture at 6:30 p.m. The event will take place in the Library auditorium and is recommended for adults, but is free and open to all.

Do you have old TVs, computers, routers, cell phones, cords, battery-operated electronics, or any other miscellaneous electronics laying around the house that you need to dispose of? University City will be hosting an electronics recycling drop-off event. This spring, we will only be offering the electronics recycling but stay tuned for a future document shredding event in the fall. The event is free for residents of St. Louis County only. The event is not open to businesses. Recycle up to two (2) monitors/TVs per vehicle at no charge*.

For other electronics, there are no limits on how many items you can recycle, and most items are free of charge. Visit ucitymo.org/recycling to see a full list of recyclable materials for this event. Questions? Call 314-505-8516.

*While funding allows. For more than two monitors or TVs, you will be charged \$30 for tube TVs or monitors; \$10 for flatscreen TVs or monitors.

The event is funded by a grant from Saint Louis County's Department of Public Health utilizing County landfill surcharge funds.

Join us for the 2025 University City Public Art series opening reception and artist talks. The 2024-2025 series is led by Associate Professor Arny Nadler and features three Sam Fox School students: Maya Dabney, Eloise Harcourt, and Peter Nesin. In collaboration with the Municipal Commission on Arts and Letters, the students each proposed and installed a temporary public sculpture for a University City public space. The works will be installed from April 6 through Labor Day.

The 39th annual University City Public Art Series is organized by WashU's Office for Socially Engaged Practice and supported by the Marvin Levy Fund and the Municipal Commission on Arts & Letters of the City of University City.



Held in Absence

Using photography and cast concrete, *Held in Absence* reflects on the erasure of Mill Creek Valley, a once-thriving Black neighborhood in St. Louis bulldozed for Highway 40. Through memory and material, the work invites viewers to consider how progress is often built on loss, challenging us to reckon with the lasting impact of displacement on collective history.



Honoring the Unseen

Honoring the Unseen celebrates the overlooked contributions of women in St. Louis. Featuring larger-than-life corporeal sculptures embedded with body imprints, the work creates an evocative experience of remembrance. A QR code at each sculpture links to an audio story, ensuring their legacies endure.

In *Let's Meet Here Again*, three extinct mammals interact with a dawn redwood, a species of tree once dominant in the Northern Hemisphere. This recreation of a scene from 150 million years ago commemorates our planet's long history and offers perspective on our changing natural world.

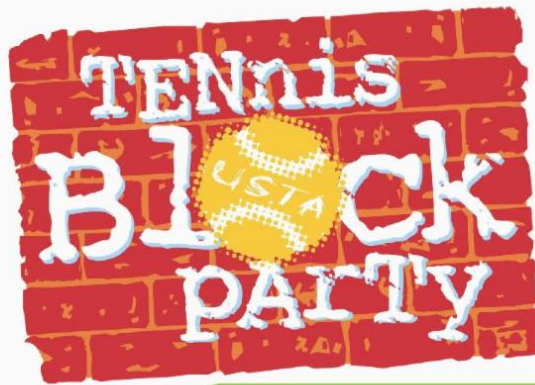

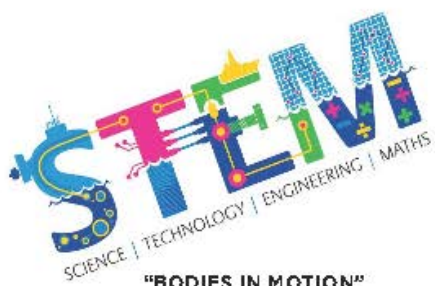
