Dierbergs Breaks Ground in University City's Market At Olive

Development!

On Thursday, May 29, University City marked a major milestone in its ongoing revitalization efforts with the groundbreaking of a new Dierbergs grocery store at the Market at Olive development. The event, held at the southeast corner of Olive Boulevard and I-170, drew community members, local leaders, and project partners together in celebration.

“This is more than a groundbreaking – it’s the beginning of a new chapter for University City,” said Mayor Terry Crow. “We are excited to welcome Dierbergs as a cornerstone of the Market at Olive, bringing fresh food options, jobs, and renewed economic energy to this important part of our city.”

The new 75,000-square-foot Dierbergs will serve as the anchor for the mixed-use Market at Olive project, which also includes over 8,500 square feet of retail, restaurant, and service space. Construction is expected to be completed in 2026.

This development represents a significant investment in the future of University City, enhancing connectivity, economic opportunity, and access to quality amenities for residents and visitors alike.



FEMA Housing Inspections Underway for Storm-Damaged Homes

Residents of University City and surrounding areas who were affected by the severe storms, straight-line winds, tornadoes, and wildfires of March 14–15, 2025, and who have registered for FEMA disaster assistance, may soon be contacted by housing inspectors.

FEMA inspectors are now evaluating properties in eligible Missouri counties—including St. Louis County—to document damage and determine potential aid. Inspections typically occur within 7 to 10 days of registration and help FEMA assess whether a residence is safe, sanitary, and livable.

What to Expect During an Inspection:

Inspectors will assess structural damage, utility functionality, and accessibility needs.

Affected residents must be present and prepared to verify ownership or occupancy (e.g., utility bill, mortgage statement).

Inspections usually take about 45 minutes.

Inspectors will never ask for money and will show official FEMA ID.

Loop Trolley Back in Operation After Storm Disruption

Good news, University City! The Loop Trolley is officially back on track starting Thursday, May 29, after a brief suspension due to the severe storms that swept through the area on May 16.

Thanks to successful storm cleanup, power restoration, and traffic signal repairs—particularly near Forest Park and DeBaliviere Avenue—the iconic trolley will resume its normal schedule:

Operating Hours:

Thursdays–Sundays, 11 a.m. to 7 p.m.

Now through October 26

Cost: Free to ride — no tickets or reservations needed!

Reminder: While the Loop Trolley is running, the Twilight Thursday concert at the Missouri History Museum has been canceled for May 29 due to weather impacts. Concerts are set to resume in September.

Stay Safe Near the Trolley

With the trolley running again, please help keep everyone safe:

Park only within the white-lined spaces—never on the trolley rails.

Avoid standing, walking, or biking on the white diagonal striping that marks the trolley path.

♀ Cross at marked crosswalks only, and always look both ways—trolleys run in

both directions and cannot swerve.



2025 Swim Instruction

"Water Babies"

ages 6 mos. - 3 yrs.

Intended to develop comfort in and around water. Parent accompanies child in the pool.

Ratio: One Instructor/6 participants

Minimum: 4 Maximum 6 (per time period)

Time: 4:30 - 5:00 pm, 5:00 pm - 5:30,
5:30 - 6:00 pm or 6:00 - 6:30 pm

"Beginners"

ages 6 yrs. - 11 yrs.

Child learns elementary backstroke, kneeling dive and continue to work on front/back crawl. Sidestroke, Deep Water Bobbing, Breaststroke Kick are introduced as well as work on other strokes

Ratio: One Instructor/6 participants

Minimum: 4 Maximum 6 (per time period)

Time: 4:30 - 5:30 pm and 5:30 - 6:30 pm

"Non-Swimmers"

ages 3 yrs. - 8 yrs.

Teaches buoyancy, breath control and introduces basic water skills. Child learns unsupported floating, kicking and beginning swimming skills. Front and back crawl are introduced

Ratio: One Instructor/6 participants

Minimum: 4 Maximum 6 (per time period)

Time: 4:30 - 5:30 pm and 5:30 - 6:30 pm

"Adults"

ages 18 yrs. and Above

This is for a variety of levels. Levels of swim knowledge and experience will determine what lesson includes. The goal is to increase proficiency and knowledge of adults in this class

Ratio: One Instructor/6 participants

Minimum: 4 Maximum 6 (per time period)

Time: 4:30 - 5:30 pm and 5:30 - 6:30 pm

Tuesdays and Thursdays

Session I: June 3 - June 26 Session II: July 8 - July 31


