**ST. LOUIS** – A Disaster Recovery Center with FEMA Individual Assistance staff is opening Tuesday, July 1 in **Clayton** to help people affected by the **March 14-15** or **May 16** disasters.

At all locations, FEMA and the U.S. Small Business Administration will help impacted residents with their disaster assistance applications, answer questions, and upload required documents.

If you are unable to apply online or by phone, someone at the Disaster Recovery Center can assist you.

The FEMA application deadline for the **March 14-15** disaster is **July 22, 2025**.

The FEMA application deadline for the **May 16** disaster is **August 11, 2025**.

If your home or personal property sustained damage not covered by insurance, FEMA may be able to provide money to help you pay for home repairs, a temporary place to live, and replace essential personal property that was destroyed.

## News Release

### FEMA Assistance May Be Available to Help with Rent

**ST. LOUIS** – If you don't have a safe place to live because of recent disasters in Missouri, you can apply for FEMA Assistance to help you pay for alternate temporary housing.

To request assistance to help with rent, homeowners and renters need to contact FEMA and let them know. This can be done by:

- First applying for FEMA Assistance at [DisasterAssistance.gov](https://DisasterAssistance.gov).
- Visiting a Disaster Recovery Center. For locations, visit: [FEMA.gov/DRC](https://FEMA.gov/DRC).
- Calling the FEMA Helpline at **1-800-621-3362**. If you use a relay service such as VRS, give FEMA your number for that service.
- Sending your request in writing to FEMA: P.O. Box 10055, Hyattsville, MD 20782-8055.

FEMA is required to do a home inspection to verify damage reported on your application.

If approved, you will receive an initial rental award of up to two months of rent. Rental Assistance may help cover your monthly rent amount, which may include a security deposit. It might not cover all rental expenses.

#### Important Deadline – March 14-15 Missouri Disaster

Homeowners and renters affected by the **March 14-15** disaster in **Bollinger, Butler, Camden, Carter, Franklin, Howell, Iron, Jefferson, Oregon, Ozark, Perry, Phelps, Reynolds, Ripley, St. Louis, Wayne, Webster and Wright counties** may be eligible. The deadline to apply for FEMA Individual Assistance is **July 22, 2025**.

#### Important Deadline – May 16 Missouri Disaster

Homeowners and renters affected by the **May 16** disaster in **St. Louis City, St. Louis County and Scott County** may also be eligible. The deadline to apply for FEMA Individual Assistance is **August 11, 2025**.

You can still ask for additional assistance, as long as you submit an initial application before the deadline.

# 2025 Swim Instruction

### "Water Babies"

ages 6 mos. - 3 yrs.

Intended to develop comfort in and around water. Parent accompanies child in the pool.

Ratio: One Instructor/6 participants

Minimum: 4 Maximum 6 (per time period)

Time: 4:30 - 5:00 pm, 5:00 pm - 5:30,  
5:30 - 6:00 pm or 6:00 - 6:30 pm

### "Beginners"

ages 6 yrs. - 11 yrs.

Child learns elementary backstroke, kneeling dive and continue to work on front/back crawl. Sidestroke, Deep Water Bobbing, Breaststroke Kick are introduced as well as work on other strokes

Ratio: One Instructor/6 participants

Minimum: 4 Maximum 6 (per time period)

Time: 4:30 - 5:30 pm and 5:30 - 6:30 pm

### "Non-Swimmers"

ages 3 yrs. - 8 yrs.

Teaches buoyancy, breath control and introduces basic water skills. Child learns unsupported floating, kicking and beginning swimming skills. Front and back crawl are introduced

Ratio: One Instructor/6 participants

Minimum: 4 Maximum 6 (per time period)

Time: 4:30 - 5:30 pm and 5:30 - 6:30 pm

### "Adults"

ages 18 yrs. and Above

This is for a variety of levels. Levels of swim knowledge and experience will determine what lesson includes. The goal is to increase proficiency and knowledge of adults in this class

Ratio: One Instructor/6 participants

Minimum: 4 Maximum 6 (per time period)

Time: 4:30 - 5:30 pm and 5:30 - 6:30 pm

Session II: July 8 - July 31
