Beginning Spring 2012, University City Public Library, in partnership with AARP Chapter 4048 University

City/Clayton, will present a series of programs entitled *Building Common Ground: Discussion of Community, Civility, and Compassion*. (See ad on pg. 13.) The goal of the project is to engage the public in contemplation and discussion of the importance of community, civility and compassion in their daily lives. UCPL is one of only 30 libraries nationally to be awarded this grant.

The library's programs are designed to enhance connections among senior citizens and youth in our community. The series begins with a three-session discussion of the book *Twelve Steps to a Compassionate Life* by Karen Armstrong scheduled for the following dates:

Community Development Implements New Permitting System

To increase efficiency, reduce departmental costs, and provide more options for conducting business with the Department of Community Development, a new permitting software system was installed in late 2011. MyGov is a web-based system that allows contractors and applicants to conveniently handle several transactions online.

The new system includes functions that allow contractors and applicants to apply for permits, request an inspection, and check fees. Contractors can also create and manage accounts, and interface with plans reviewers and inspectors. Another useful feature of MyGov is an "Action Center." This tool is available

through University City's website (www.ucitymo.org) and provides access to applications, forms, and questions and answers via a searchable set of Frequently Asked Questions. A variety of requests can also be logged into the Action Center, ranging from police issues, trash pick-up, and good neighbor policies, to complaints about pot holes, litter, hazardous trees etc. A follow-up response is prompt: provide an e-mail address to receive an automatic reply or check back with the Action Center.

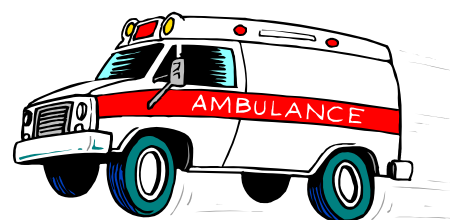
Do you need a new or replacement smoke detector in your home?

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Spring Leaf Collection Begins in March

The first citywide leaf collection for 2012 begins in March in the West Area during the week of March 19, Central Area during the week of March 26, and ends with the East Area during the week of April 2.

All leaves must be placed at the curbside by Sunday night to be collected during the collection week. Only leaves will be collected, no gum balls, limbs, or other yard debris. Yard waste is picked up on the regular trash and recycling collection day if it is placed in a Kraft paper bag with a Yard Waste Sticker attached. Leaf collection trucks make one pass only on each street.

Do You Recycle?

University City is participating in the **2012 Cans for Cash City Recycling Challenge** sponsored by the United States Conference of Mayors and Novelis, Inc. The challenge is a competition between cities to collect the most aluminum cans during a 4 week period. Winning cities will be determined by the ratio of the city population to the total number of cans recycled during a four week collection period between March 1 and April 30, 2012. U City won the 4th place award of \$5,000 in last year's competition. Three awards are available this year, 1st place-, \$25,000, 2nd place-\$15,000 and 3rd place-\$5,000. The awards will be presented in June at the 2012 U. S. Conference of Mayors annual meeting in Orlando.

2012 Earth Day Youth Art Contest

Public Works Project Provides 74% Energy Savings

Four ceiling mounted lights located over the filling station at the Public Works and Parks maintenance yard were recently replaced with LED fixtures.

The previous fixtures each housed a 400 watt metal halide bulb which has a lifetime of approximately 12,000 hours. This calculates to three years of night lighting before needing to be replaced. The new LED fixtures operate at 98 watts and have an estimated lifetime of 17-25 years of night lighting before needing to be replaced.

The cost for the new fixtures and the labor to install them totaled \$2,882.

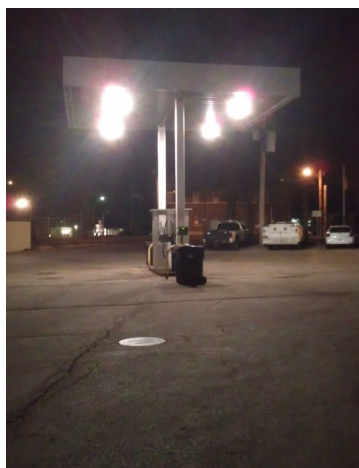
This University City energy efficiency retrofit project was paid for with funds from a Department of Energy Grant promoting Energy conservation and efficiency. The table below shows the cost analysis of this change:

	400W MH	98W LED (<i>new</i>)
kWh/year (energy used)	7232	1872
Energy Charge per year (based on 2M metered energy)	\$580.01	\$127.04
Cost per year: Parts, labor, plus energy	\$677.21	\$260.33

These savings amount to a 74% reduction in energy which equals \$453 energy savings/year. The overall cost of operating these lights will reduce by 62%, or \$417 savings per year.

Scholarship Program Available for U City Residents

Everyone should have the opportunity to improve their quality of life through recreation facilities and programs. To help meet this goal, the Department of Community Development – Recreation Division offers a recreation scholarship to income-qualified University City residents. Funding is limited.

The scholarship award amount will be based on all household income sources, including related and unrelated people residing in a household. Individual and family scholarships are available. Scholarships are provided at a sliding scale, dependent on income, at a discounted rate of 25%, 50%, or 75% of the program's adopted fee.

Scholarships are available for the following:

- Youth before and after school programs, and city operated full day recreation programs (i.e. Summer Youth Recreation Program, etc.)
- Fitness and/or Leisure education classes. Lessons and senior social activities will be limited to two (2) per person per fiscal quarter (July 1-Sept 30, Oct 1-Dec 31, Jan 1-Mar 31, Apr 1-June 30)
- Centennial Commons memberships and Heman Pool/Natatorium Swim Passes
- University City Sports Association or University City Soccer Club youth sports player fees

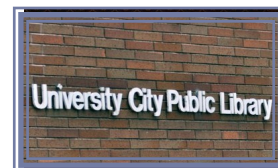

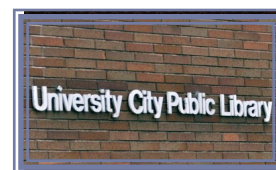

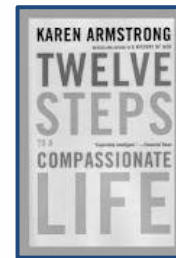
